Communiqué

The Ministry of Agro-Industry and Food Security wishes to inform the livestock breeders that the Livestock and Veterinary Division of the Ministry shall continue to provide veterinary care to livestock on a 24-hour basis for the following emergency cases only:

- Dystocia
- Severe burns
- Poisoning
- Prolapses
- Bloat

No other cases will be attended to during the confinement period.

For non-emergency cases, advice shall be dispensed by phone and all cases will have to be reported to the Réduit Head Office on telephone numbers 4541016 or 4541017.

Note: Severe action will be taken against breeders reporting fake cases.

All feed distribution points operated by private feed manufacturers and distributors shall operate from 0900 to 1500 hours on weekdays only.

The public is hereby informed that poultry shops have also been authorised to operate during the confinement period **subject to obtaining their Work Access Permits.**
